Upper division courses: All students are required to have a minimum of 42 hrs. upper division (300 level or above) courses distributed throughout Major/Supporting/Gen Ed/Free Electives categories. If 300 level classes are taken for Gen. Ed. or for Approved elective, they can be used to fulfill the 42 hours instead of upper division free electives.
